#### 2020 Advocacy During Local "Safer at Home" Pandemic Orders

- During local "shelter" phases, TARO worked with local municipalities to clarify and promote golf and tennis as safe and essential recreational activities;
- TARO worked to maintain golf course and landscape maintenance as essential activities;
- Promoted, to government officials, best practices implemented to maintain a safe playing environment for golf and tennis;
- Coordinated efforts among Allied Associations to have Governor Abbott declare golf as a safe recreational activity throughout all phases of Open Texas and provided guidance to the Texas golf industry;
- Successfully lobbied on behalf of the Texas golf industry to have the one-rider golf cart restriction lifted in Phase 3 of Open Texas and the restriction on golf foursomes;
- Communicated ever-evolving guidelines to club professionals and allied associations.
